The Ball tonight, a wonderful and longstanding Philadelphia tradition, exemplifies the charitable spirit of giving back to our community by the young ladies and gentlemen. Now, in its 51st year, Special Olympics Pennsylvania has flourished, growing into an organization that trains 16,000 athletes who compete in 21 Olympic-type sports annually at over 300 local, sectional and state level competitions. The sports that Special Olympics Pennsylvania provides for children and adults with intellectual disabilities, give the athletes continuing opportunities to develop physical fitness, demonstrate courage, experience joy, and participate in a sharing of gifts, skills and friendship with their families, other Special Olympics athletes, and the community. All training and competition opportunities are provided free of charge to the athletes and their families, enabling everyone to experience the benefits of Special Olympics that extend well beyond the playing field. Notably, the Philadelphia Charity Ball wholeheartedly pledges its support of "The Inclusion Revolution", a campaign launched by Special Olympics "to end discrimination against people with intellectual disabilities and to create a fully inclusive world".

I would like to express my deep gratitude to so many people whose hard work and unrelentless dedication to the success of this Ball does not go unnoticed. I



All training and competition opportunities are provided free of charge to the athletes and their families, enabling everyone to experience the benefits of Special Olympics that extend well beyond the playing field.






Timmy Medal




KIERA LEE MAHONEY

daughter of MR. PETER E. ZELOV & MRS. SUZANNE W. ZELOV


Espy is an eighteen-year-old college freshman. She attends Southern Methodist University in Dallas, TX, where she majors in Advertising.


Before attending Southern Methodist University, Espy attended The Agnes Irwin School, where she graduated in the spring of 2021.

THOMAS BEAUCLERC CHRISTOPHER


Son of Mr. Thomas Christopher & Mrs. Courtney Rogers Christopher


JACK HAMILTON PAYNE
