I am delighted to welcome you to the 142nd Philadelphia Charity Ball. Your attendance and participation testify that you share the vision of continuing the mission established by our beloved organization over 142 years ago. That is, to inspire and encourage philanthropy in young people and to raise funds for worthy charities. The Ball tonight, a wonderful and longstanding Philadelphia tradition, exemplifies the charitable spirit of giving back to our community by the young ladies and gentlemen. Let us all be inspired to follow the lead of these courageous and benevolent young people, leaders among their peers, as they continue to choose a life in which philanthropy plays a large part.

Once again, this year's beneficiary is Special Olympics Pennsylvania. In May 1970, its first-ever competition was held with only 135 athletes participating in a small track and field competition at West Chester University.

Now, in its 52nd year, Special Olympics Pennsylvania has flourished, growing into an organization that trains 16,000 athletes who compete in 21 Olympic-type sports annually at over 300 local, sectional and state level competitions. The sports that Special Olympics Pennsylvania provides for children and adults with intellectual disabilities, give the athletes continuing opportunities to develop physical fitness, demonstrate courage, experience joy, and participate in a sharing of gifts, skills and friendship with their families, other Special Olympics athletes, and the community. All training and competition opportunities are provided free of charge to the athletes and their families, enabling everyone to experience the benefits of Special Olympics that extend well beyond the playing field. Notably, the Philadelphia Charity Ball wholeheartedly pledges its support of "The Inclusion Revolution", a campaign launched

by Special Olympics "to end discrimination against people with intellectual disabilities and to create a fully inclusive world".

I would like to express my deep gratitude to so many people whose hard work and relentless dedication to the success of this Ball does not go unnoticed. 

daughter of Andrea Williams Pettibone & John Samuel Pettibone III


London, a senior, has attended Episcopal Academy in Newtown Square, Pennsylvania since her pre-Kindergarten year.


MARYELIZABETH GILLESPIE ROUSE OLDS GREELEY
