Welcome to the 143rd Philadelphia Charity Ball! Your participation in tonight's ball is a testament of your shared vision to carry on the mission of our beloved organization established 143 years ago. That is, to inspire and encourage philanthropy in young people and to raise funds for deserving charities. This beautiful ball, steeped in Philadelphia tradition, exemplifies the charitable spirit of our young ladies and gentlemen of contributing to our community. Let these courageous and benevolent young people, leaders among their peers, inspire us to follow their lead as they continue to choose a life in which philanthropy plays a central part.

Once again, this year's beneficiary is Special Olympics Pennsylvania. In May 1970, its first-ever competition was held with only 135 athletes participating in a small track and field competition at West Chester University. Now, in its 53rd year, Special Olympics Pennsylvania has flourished, growing into an organization that trains nearly 16,000 Special Olympics Pennsylvania athletes to compete across 54 local county programs at over 300 annual competitions in Olympic-type sports with the help of over 21 coaches and volunteers. In particular, the Philadelphia Charity Ball altruistically vows its support of "The Inclusion Revolution", a campaign launched by Special Olympics "to end discrimination against people with intellectual disabilities and to create a fully inclusive world".



Our Mission

The mission of the Philadelphia Charity Ball is two-fold: to raise funds for non-profit organizations focused on youth in Philadelphia, and to inspire the young people of Philadelphia to make philanthropy a central part of their lives.

The Philadelphia Charity Ball is a tradition that dates back to 1881. It is a formal celebration and gathering that has raised millions of dollars for a variety of worthwhile charities over the years. Each year the Ball endeavors to build on and continue this tradition. For the first century, the beneficiaries of the Ball were the Philadelphia hospitals and the results of these events are evident throughout our local hospital system.

The Philadelphia Charity Ball is part of the fabric of the history of Philadelphia. Many past participants have gone on to assume positions in Philadelphia area charitable organizations.

I am filled with gratitude for so many people whose hard work and unwavering support are instrumental in the success of this ball. All training and competition opportunities are provided free of charge to the athletes and their families, enabling everyone to experience the benefits of Special Olympics that extend well beyond the playing field.
